down payment

A down payment of 10-20% will be requested up front before the work is started (for example — if the total required contribution is \$400, a down payment of \$40-\$80 will be required). Once the work is completed, payment arrangements are available for any remaining balance.

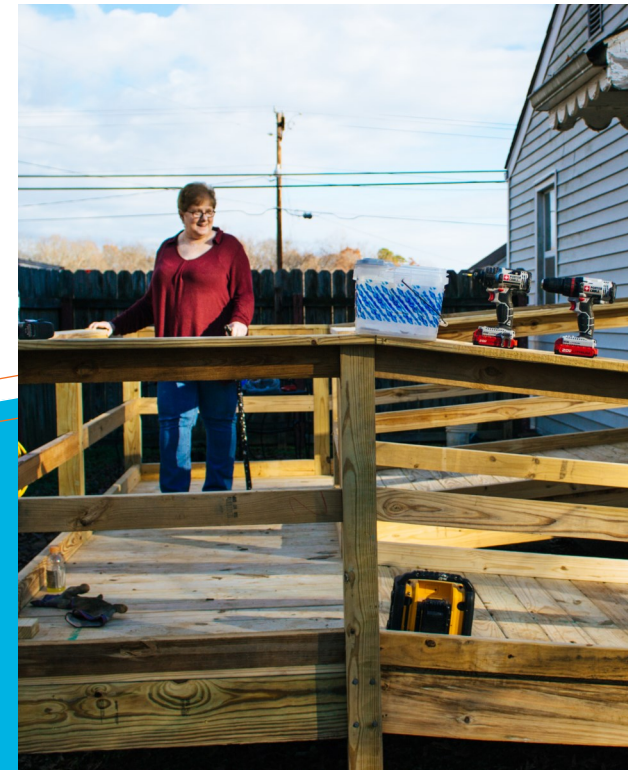
- Roof

guidelines

Following are the basic guidelines of the program:

- The house must be owned by the applicant.
- Work will not be done on mobile homes (with the exception of wheelchair access ramps)
- Applicants must be low income — fall between 20% and 60% of the Area Median Income (AMI).
